



## G-MEO SUMMER PROGRAM SESSION II - GUANGZHOU

July 15, 2016 - August 13, 2016

2016 g-MEO Summer Program Session II will be held in **Guangzhou** on the **Wushan campus of South China University of Technology (SCUT)**, a major national research university with 27 schools including science, engineering, business management, arts and social science, etc. Guangzhou, one of the five National Central Cities in China, is a metropolis with a population of 13 million. Its close proximity to **Hong Kong** and **Macau** also makes it an anchor city to the Pearl River Delta Economic Zone and motherland for many oversea Chinese.

**School of Record (SOR): Fairleigh Dickinson University (FDU)** - one of the most respected regional universities on the East Coast, will serve as the SOR to issue the official transcript for courses offered by the consortium of accredited American universities to students who are duly admitted and have successfully completed one or more for-credit courses on this program. Applicants must obtain the approval of his/her academic advisor from their home institution before he/she can enroll.

**Who Should Attend:** All college students in the US. g-MEO offers a unique opportunity for both American and international students (including Chinese international students completing college degrees in the US).

**Fields of Study:** All courses are taught in English by instructors appointed by individual schools that offer those courses with the concurrence of FDU. Students can enroll in up to 2 courses during the 4 week program. Courses are available in Business, Economics, Social Sciences & Humanities, Language Studies, and Science. **Extracurricular Activities and Professional Development:** g-MEO staff will organize a number of cultural events and site visits as well as conduct one or more professional development seminars.

**Accommodation:** Students have the choice to live at the hotel near campus. Housing fee is **\$580** at a standard double occupancy room if you apply after **April 30, 2016**. Housing fee is **\$600** after the deadline. You also have the choice to choose single room or live off campus.
