"We had an excellent visit with G-MEO and FDU's AFS (Alternative Fall Semester) on October 19. We had a good meeting with Sara, observed the World Civilization class and met with several students. The students communicated that they are very happy with the program. The morning turned into the afternoon with us having a very nice lunch with Dr. Zhou (teaching Intro to Philosophy and World Civilization), Sara and one of her staff. The program is being well administered and students are active and engaged. Enrollment this semester is 101 students, total, 94 of which are from American University. Several students are majoring in communication and/or international relations and hope there can be more courses in these areas in the spring. The vast majority of students are from outside of Chengdu and chose it specifically over Beijing and Shanghai where AU also has options (so three total in China this semester). Overall our visit went well and we were impressed with the program. We plan to visit again before the end of the semester."
