WHY CHINA?

Broadening Horizons

You may be surprised that your child wants to study in China, but there are so many great reasons to choose this country:

- **Language** - Mandarin has more native speakers than any other language (929 million) and is the second most spoken language in the world (1.1 billion).
- **Business** - China remains a major economic power and major US trade partner.

II. PRE-DEPARTURE

PREPARING FOR ADVENTURE

as your child prepares to embark on a journey to China, we understand that you may have feelings of uncertainty and concern. You might wonder about the quality of food and housing in China, access to medical services, issues with language and withdrawing money while overseas. We encourage you to ask questions about these topics and talk regularly with your child about preparation and planning.

Keep in mind that you can be a part of the conversation without limiting your child's independence. With help from you and experienced G-MEO professionals, your child can navigate the pre-departure process and get ready for the experience of a lifetime.

CONVERSATION STARTERS

We recommend double checking these items with your child.

Financial Aid

- Check with the financial aid office at your child's university to see if their aid is transferrable to G-MEO programs.

Scholarships

- Check the G-MEO website to see a full list of offered scholarships.
- Note which ones your child is eligible to receive.

Travel Documents

- Have a valid passport.
- Double check that it does not need to be renewed.
- Make sure you received a visa application package from G-MEO.

Health

- Activate your account on the GoBlue website and checked to see if any prescriptions are available in China.
- If not, make sure you have enough of your prescriptions to last the full duration of your time abroad.

Medical Records

- Contact your physician to complete all medical forms and get a copy of your immunization records.
- Make sure that all health forms are uploaded to the online application portal.

Accessing Money

- Contact your bank and credit card company to let them know that you will be traveling abroad.
- Learn about ATMs, withdrawal fees, and card function overseas for your bank.

Travel and Packing

- Enter your flight information (all flights, including connecting flights) to the online application portal.
- Check the airline's website for information about baggage policies.

- be sure to pack credit & debit cards

Packing

- China has almost everything you need, but be sure to pack any special preferences

Study Abroad Office

- Check with your university study abroad office to make sure you completed all necessary steps and paperwork



III. IN CHENGDU



Adjustment & Change

After your child arrives in China, they will go through a period of rapid change and adjustment. As they get used to new housing, make new friends, and become accustomed to Chinese language and culture, our professional G-MEO staff will be there to provide support and assistance at all times.



Keep in mind that you may not be in constant communication with your child upon arrival. Try to have a positive attitude and trust in the G-MEO team to be there for your child as they get used to their new environment.



When you reach out, remember that there is a 12 hour time difference from the Eastern time zone as well as varying levels of internet access. It's important to be flexible and find a method of communication that works for both of you.

Overview

Health Insurance

All G-MEO students are enrolled in GeoBlue health insurance, which includes accident and sickness insurance, emergency medical evacuations, accidental death and dismemberment insurance, and 24-hour international emergency assistance.

Emergencies

G-MEO has its own Crisis Management Plan in case of an emergency. The 24/7 emergency hotline is **+86-158-2814-0846** for Chengdu.

Orientation

Onsite orientation with our Chengdu staff members will take place at the beginning of the program and will last 3 days. This way we ensure that students are taken care of from day one and learn almost everything they need to know from the start.



Airport Pickup

Onsite staff members arrange airport pickup and transportation to university housing after students arrive at Chengdu International Airport. It is important that students enter their flight information in our Online Application Portal.

Housing

Students live in standard double-occupancy rooms for international students on our campus. Rooms are recently renovated and offer private bathrooms and Wi-Fi access.

Weather

Weather in China varies significantly by region and season. Chengdu has an overall mild climate with four distinct seasons that include warm, humid summers and chilly winters.

In addition to administering the onsite orientation, the Chengdu American Center staff are available 24/7 to provide students with guidance and support. Our team has worked with students for years and understand that everyone wants to have fun when they go abroad. Nonetheless, we always emphasize the importance of personal safety and give the students the tools to explore their new cultural environment in a safe way.

International calls can be expensive, so we recommend that you consider email or downloading a messaging app on your phone. Just remember that your child is in a different time zone with varying levels of internet availability. Try to be patient and understanding if you don't receive an immediate response. G-MEO staff members are always on hand to help, they are your child's best resource when they have questions or concerns.

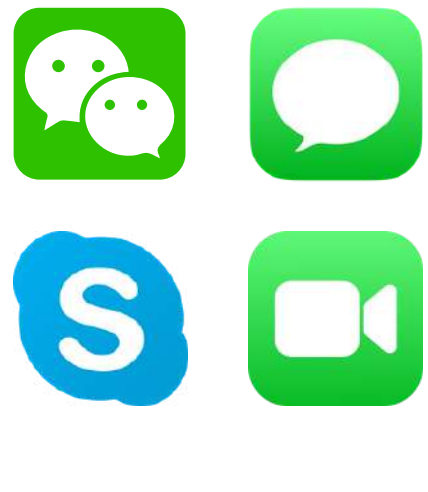

Making the Most of China

Health & Wellness

As a student with asthma, Maman Cisse had to be aware of air pollution that could impact her health. “The program has the best doctor in Chengdu (the Global Doctors Clinic and with insurance that covers all the expenses). Unique Hands-on Experience

III. RETURNING HOME

Back to “Normal” Life

Students returning home from study abroad often find that what was once familiar has become unfamiliar. This phase, known as ‘reverse culture shock’, can often cause students to experience feelings of frustration, irritability, and loneliness. In this period of transition, we encourage you to be patient and look for ways to help your child gradually settle back into life at home. G-MEO will send a welcome home package with more information about reverse culture shock and suggestions for helping your child settle in.



Careers and the Future

Studying abroad is more than just an academic and cultural experience. After returning home, your child can translate their time abroad into professional opportunities. Try talking with your child about their professional interests and think of ways that G-MEO and China can fit into a career track.

Resume Updates
